Cockroaches are considered an opportunistic and filthy species of insect. They will eat virtually anything and as a result can carry a lot of diseases. Three main species can be found inside buildings in New Zealand; German, American and Gisborne cockroaches <u>https://hawkeye.kiwi/info/cockroaches/</u> has information to help identify these species.

Of the three, German cockroaches are the most problematic because they collect together, move very quickly and breed rapidly so if you see one of these, you can be sure there will be a lot more. In contrast American cockroaches breed a lot more slowly so the appearance of these does not necessarily indicate a troublesome infestation. Gisborne cockroaches are usually more solitary that the other two species and will often come inside 'by mistake' so like the American cockroach, the appearance of these does not necessarily indicate a bad infestation.

Hawkeye Cockroach Bait is especially effective against German and American cockroaches. It will also kill Gisborne cockroaches if they come across it and feed on it, but they do not seek it out. Hawkeye Cockroach Bait contains an active ingredient that can pass from one cockroach to another (called the daisy chain effect) when they feed on exposed cockroach excrement of their cadavers (we did say they were filthy!) Cockroaches like to harbour in dry, warm, dark places with very little space so can often be found underneath fridges or ovens.

A faster result may be obtained with a severe infestation by using a combination of Hawkeye Flea, Ant and Roach Spray as well as Hawkeye Cockroach Bait. In this instance the spray will eliminate a larger number of cockroaches while they crawl over a treated area, leaving the bait to mop up the remainder, which then doesn't require all the cockroaches to find and consume the bait dots that have been placed out. Directions for Use:

Place the Hawkeye applicator dots under or behind any furniture, under the sink in the kitchen and bathroom, next to the dishwasher, in cabinet, behind fridge, freezer and the oven where cockroach infestation is found and apply Hawkeye Cockroach Bait on the dots on the marked area (dime sized). Also apply Hawkeye roach bait in cracks and crevices.

Do not apply Hawkeye Cockroach Bait on bench tops, or surface areas where food preparation is performed, or anywhere it can get in contact with food. In commercial food processing areas ensure Hawkeye Cockroach Bait is placed to prevent contact with any food products or food handling products.

Put the applicator dots close to areas that roaches frequent (cracks and crevices). Roaches do not need to feed everyday so only some of the roaches will emerge to search for food each day, so the closer the bait is to them, the better.

If you have a large infestation, place the dot applicators about 3 inches apart in several locations at the same time. For smaller colonies, they can be placed 2 to 3 feet apart. Focus on the kitchen and bathroom more. They are the most likely cockroach hiding spots.

Monitor and reapply- Keep an eye on the amount of bait fed and check back every couple of days. Reapply on the bait on the dot applicators if all is gone until you see no more feeding or cockroach movement or droppings (if that was the case before).

Note: If it looks like the Hawkeye Cockroach Bait has not been frequented by roaches, then try changing the placement of the dot applicators to another location in the house and checking again in a couple days.

Do not spray around your dot placements with cleaning agents or other insecticides, as this can discourage cockroaches from taking the bait.

TIP: The applicator dots are reusable so wipe them clean and put them back on the backing paper they come on when finished for the next time they are needed.

Disposal Information: Collect Spillage. Dispose of product only be using according to the label. Empty tube as much as possible. Cut in half, wrap in plastic and dispose empty tube in domestic rubbish. Clean application patches with a damp paper towel for reuse and place used paper towel in domestic rubbish.
